Locally recruited teachers in the European Schools do a competent job with high personal commitment. Year after year, they help thousands of students to reach an internationally recognized graduation: the European Baccalaureate. They contribute greatly to the success of the fourteen European Schools in Belgium, Luxemburg, Great Britain, Spain, Italy, the Netherlands and Germany. The locally recruited teachers are the backbone of these schools. For that, they deserve respect and appreciation. They are entitled to an adequate payment, social security and participation at work.

The Gewerkschaft Erziehung und Wissenschaft (GEW) speaks up for fair working conditions for locally recruited teachers in the European Schools – not only in Munich, Frankfurt and Karlsruhe, but also in six more EU countries with European Schools as well. Together with partner unions in the ETUCE, which represents 130 education unions with eleven million members, we advocate for fair payment, permanent contracts and a strong and independent representation of locally recruited teachers' interests.

In 2015, the European Court of Justice decided that national law does not apply for locally recruited teachers at the European Schools. Yet, this does not mean that locally recruited teachers at the European Schools do not have rights. The European Social Charter guarantees all employees in Europe the right to social security, participation in the determination and improvement of working conditions, freedom of association and collective negotiations. Therefore, the GEW promotes collective bargaining and a collective agreement on working conditions and payment for locally recruited teachers in the European Schools.

We are a strong union: The GEW represents 280.000 teachers, educators, social workers and professors in schools, nurseries and in higher education in Germany. Abroad we support our members at Goethe Institutes, German Schools, schools where the German Language Certificate can be acquired and schools of the Bundeswehr (German Armed Forces). Of course, we also support GEW members who are working as seconded teachers in a European School abroad for a certain number of years and who afterwards normally continue to teach in Germany.

- Employees with a wage agreement pay 0.73 % of the respective pay scale group und level; employees without wage agreement pay 0.7 % of their gross income.
- The minimum fee is always 0.6 % of the lowest level of pay scale group 1 TVöD.
- Members in teacher training or completing an internship pay a fixed amount of 4 Euro.
- Retired members pay 0.6 % of their retirement income.
